<p data-bbox="245 359 422 436">Last/Final Word</p> <hr data-bbox="233 485 433 489"/> <p data-bbox="237 533 430 590"><i>Suggested Time:</i> 20-30 minutes</p>	<p data-bbox="492 327 604 359">Purpose</p> <p data-bbox="492 367 1377 478">To encourage all students to participate as both active speakers and active listeners through a structured discussion where students respond to a text.</p> <p data-bbox="492 527 643 558">How to Use</p> <ol data-bbox="540 567 1417 1312" style="list-style-type: none"><li data-bbox="540 567 1417 758">1. While reading a text, ask students to find and mark 3 quotes from the text that they would like to discuss with their classmates. Encourage students to find quotes that are interesting or include new information or quotes with which they agree or disagree.<li data-bbox="540 766 1417 919">2. Have students record each quote they marked in their text on a shared online doc. On a separate piece of paper, ask students to write why they selected this quote as well as any comments or feelings about the quote. They will need this in the discussion.<li data-bbox="540 928 1417 1150">3. Divide students into groups and have them connect virtually via chat or video conference. Have one student share a quote. Provide 1-2 minutes for the other two students to discuss the quote. Prompt the discussion with questions like <i>What do you think it means? What are your reactions to this quote? Why is it important in the text?</i><li data-bbox="540 1159 1417 1270">4. After the discussion, have the student who wrote the quote share their thoughts from their separate piece of paper, giving them the final word.<li data-bbox="540 1278 1417 1312">5. Repeat with the quotes collected from the other students. <p data-bbox="492 1360 878 1392">Variation Final Word Images</p> <p data-bbox="492 1400 1403 1512">Use images instead of quotations. Have students select three images from a collection. For each image, record why they selected the image, what they think it represents, and why it is important.</p> <p data-bbox="492 1560 678 1591">Teaching Tips</p> <ul data-bbox="540 1600 1403 1705" style="list-style-type: none"><li data-bbox="540 1600 1403 1705">● Ask students to propose questions to their group that the text raised for them while reading, providing their own answers on a separate sheet of paper.
