P	<b>CLAIM:</b> Write an opinion or position in response to the question.	
(P)	REASON: Provide reasons why you believe your claim.	

Q	Provide <b>EVIDENCE</b> from the text to support your claim.
(P)	<b>REASONING:</b> Explain how your evidence connects back to your claim.
	<b>COUNTERARGUMENT:</b> Include at least one good reason why others might disagree with your claim or provide a different point of view.
